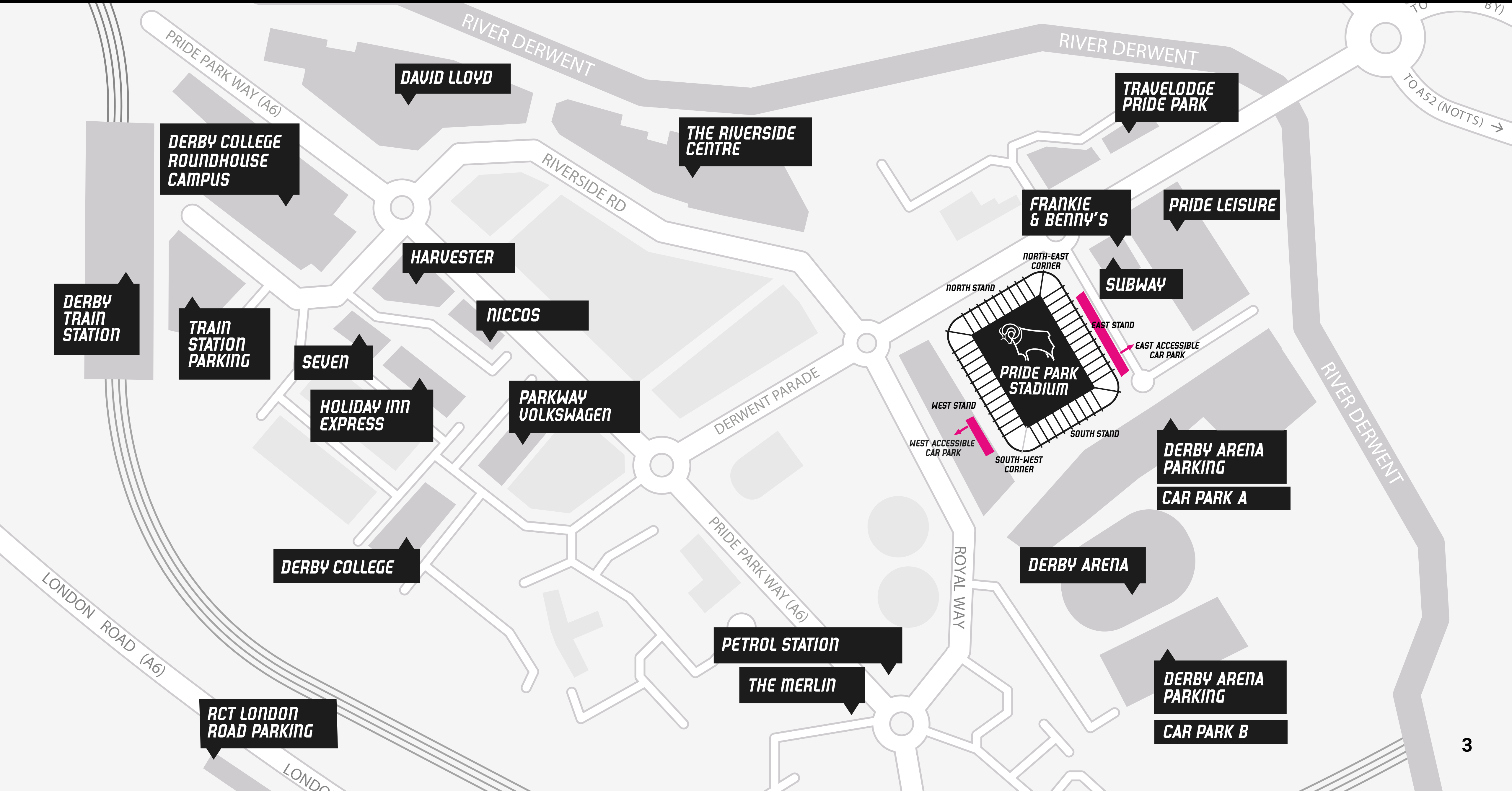

CUSTOMER SERVICE

The club actively welcomes suggestions and feedback from its supporters, which helps it to deliver an improved and more effective service.

Reporting Incidents/Concern

We recognise that most supporters come to Pride Park Stadium to watch a football match without experiencing abusive or indecent language and gestures, and unruly behaviour from others.

Swearing in the Family Stand is unacceptable. Discrimination of any kind including shouting, chanting or actions such as racist, sectarian, homophobic, sexist, or anti-disability behaviour, is unacceptable.

If you experience or witness any of the above, please ask one of the matchday stewards to report the incident or your concerns, enabling us to act accordingly.

Matchday Text Service

On a home matchday at Pride Park Stadium, you can report incidents or concerns directly to Derby County Match Control. Start your text with **DCFC**, then type your message and send to **88440**. Please include as much information as possible, including the Stand, Row, and Seat details of where the incident or your concern occurred.

Complaints Policy

The club will seek to respond to all complaints within 10 working days of receipt. Thereafter complaints will, if appropriate, be subject to internal investigations.

REASONABLE ADJUSTMENTS

Derby County Football Club operates a ticketing policy that recognises that disabled supporters may need assistance to fully enjoy the match day experience and offers a variety of reasonable adjustments based on individual supporters needs, not their 'disability.'

By completing a simple application form together with submitting the appropriate supporting documentation, we can plan to meet your needs during your visit to Pride Park Stadium and that accessible facilities and services are only used by the supporters that need them.

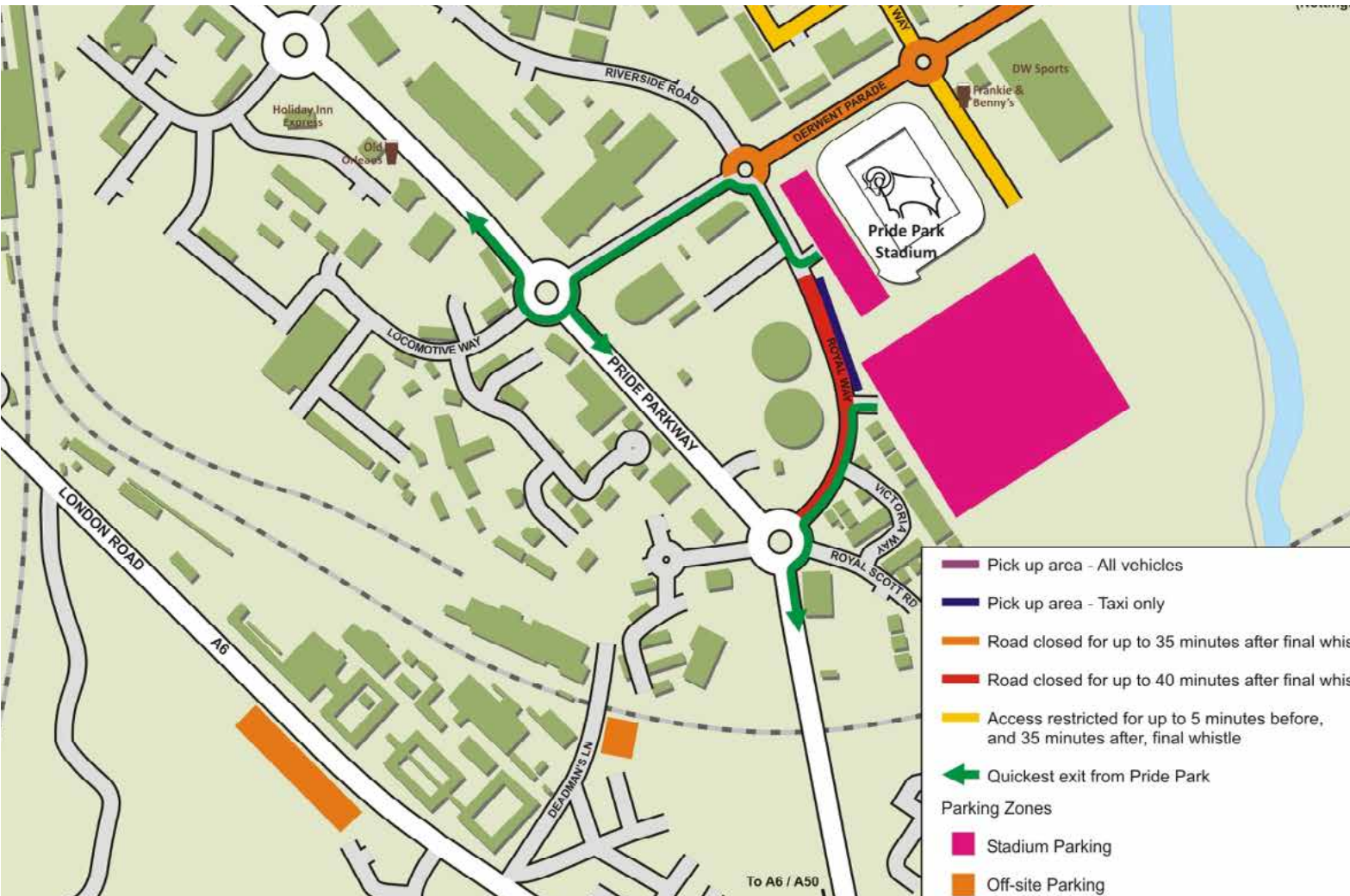

Traffic Exclusion Zone/Resident Parking Zones

In the interest of pedestrian safety, a traffic exclusion zone is imposed around Pride Park Stadium on matchdays. It is in operation from 90 minutes prior to kick off and up to 60 minutes after the final whistle with precise timing dependent upon traffic and pedestrian movement on Derwent Parade and Royal Way.

Resident parking zones are in operation on matchdays with parking fines issued if contravened. The club advises supporters, where possible, to use official car parks.

Matchday First Aid Medical Provision

There are two St John Ambulance medical rooms located at Pride Park Stadium on matchdays. These are in the Northwest corner of the lower concourse and in the Southwest corner of the lower concourse. Matchday stewards are first aid trained and senior matchday stewards are trained in how to use a defibrillator which is located within the Security Office adjacent to the Toyota West Stand Main Entrance.

Medication

Please email **disability.access@dcfc.co.uk** or call **01332 667528** if you need to bring essential medication into Pride Park Stadium.

Cashless

Apart from external catering vendors, Pride Park Stadium is a cashless environment accepting only contactless, debit card and credit card means of payment.

Bag Policy

Bags are subject to search and must be no larger than 45cm x 30cm x 15cm. There is no on-site storage facility for oversize bags.

Supporters are prohibited from bringing refreshments into Pride Park Stadium. However, if a supporter has specific dietary or sustenance requirements because of a medical condition, please contact the Disability Team on **01332 667528** in advance of attending the game.

Additionally, supporters must be a minimum of 18 years old to purchase and/or consume alcohol in Pride Park Stadium. Photo ID may be requested to determine proof of age.

Flag Policy

Obviously, the club wants an exciting atmosphere at Pride Park Stadium and encourages all supporters to bring flags and banners, however these must adhere to our guidelines.

The club reserves the right to refuse flags or banners to be displayed, particularly if:

- The content is considered offensive, discriminatory, defamatory or inflammatory
- Any part of the flag or banner could potentially be used as a weapon or compromises public safety
- Any item above the area of **600mm x1000mm** must be flame retardant and carry a fire safety certificate provided in advance of matchday
- The flagpole should be no bigger than **7mm** in diameter and **1000mm** in length
- The flagpole material should be plastic and rounded covered at each end

- Flags and banners should be presented to a matchday steward prior to entry where they will be inspected for compliance with the guidelines
- The club reserves the right to confiscate any flags or banners not approved



STAYING OVER?

Leonardo Hotel

Leonardo Hotel, Derby is ideally located in the Cathedral Quarter, which is bursting at the seams with heritage and culture. The hotel is only a 4-minute drive from Pride Park Stadium, making it a convenient place to stay pre- or post-match. The hotel has 213 spacious, well-lit bedrooms and offers several bedrooms suitable for wheelchair access.

Wheelchair accessible rooms have been designed to the highest specifications and include:

- Lowered beds for easy transfer from a wheelchair to the bed
- Wide doorways
- Sufficient floor space to manoeuvre
- Fully accessible bathrooms, with roll-in shower, lower sink, grab rails and pull cords
- Throughout the hotel, additional accessibility features include:

Accessible toilets in public areas
Lifts to all floors

TICKETING & MEMBERSHIP

ACCESSIBILITY INFORMATION: THE TICKET OFFICE

The Ticket Office is located on the west side of the stadium and has three doors that lead into it; one single door and one set of double doors. The door handles are at an appropriate height for most users, including wheelchair users and those with limited manual dexterity.

The flooring and walls have good colour contrast, and the Ticket Office also offers a lowered counter for wheelchair users and people of shorter stature.



WHICH STAND SHOULD I CHOOSE?

SOUTH-WEST CORNER

offers mid-price tickets in upper tier only and can get a little noisy with some of the supporters' choice of language and behaviour not considered suitable for everyone.

SOUTH STAND

offers the lowest price tickets in both upper and lower tiers and is regarded as being the most animated with some of the supporters' choice of language and behaviour not considered suitable for everyone.

Seats within the lower tier are subject to inclement weather

WEST STAND

offers the highest price tickets in both upper and lower tiers directly above and adjacent to the players tunnel and team dugouts and is generally regarded as one of the more reserved stands.

NORTH-WEST CORNER

NORTH STAND

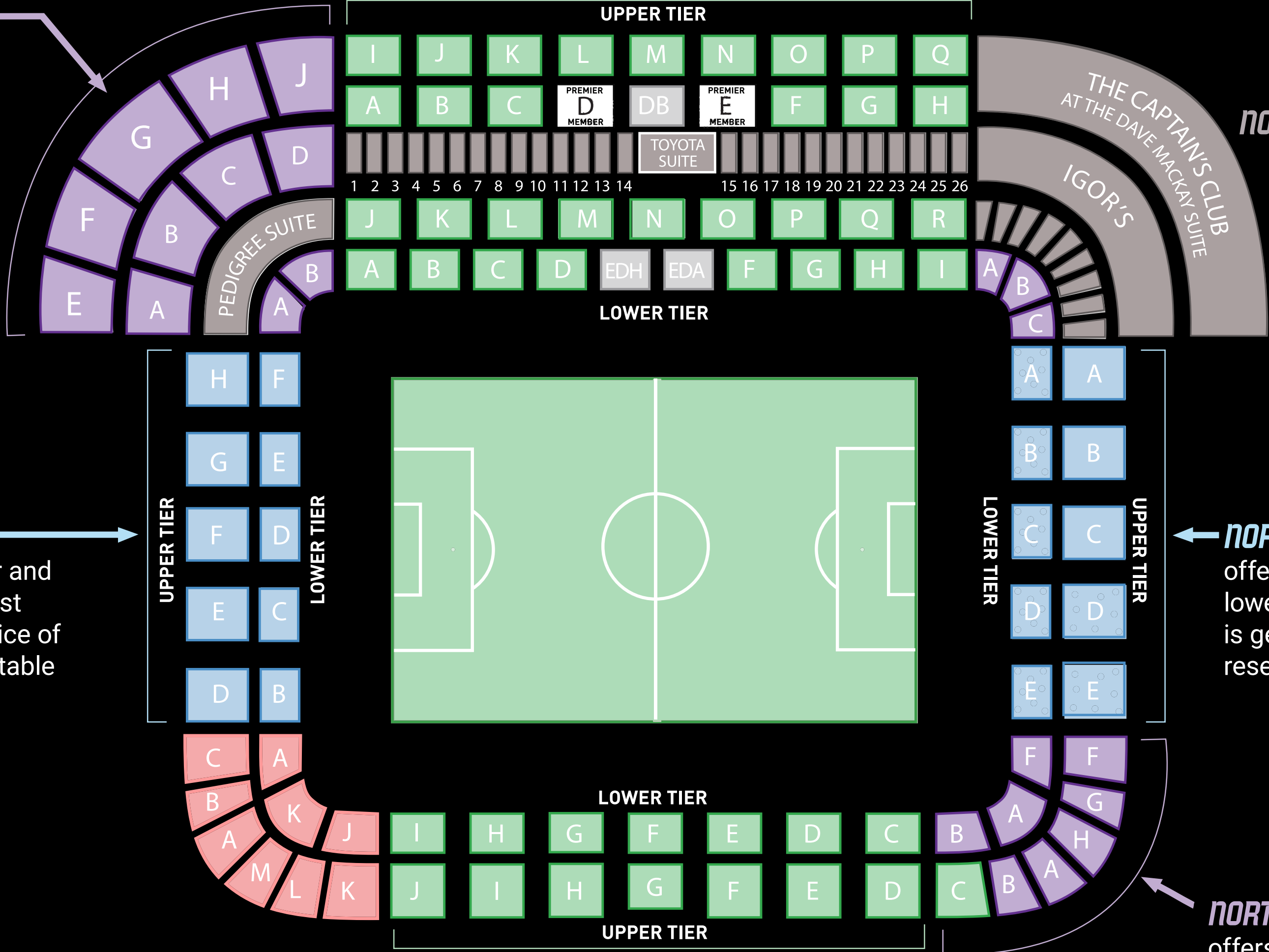
offers the lowest price tickets in both upper and lower tiers and popular with families. This stand is generally regarded as one of the more reserved stands.

NORTH-EAST CORNER

offers mid-price tickets in both upper and lower tiers and is our dedicated family area.

EAST STAND

offers the highest price tickets in both upper and lower tiers, directly opposite the hospitality facilities and can get a little noisy, especially in the sections adjacent to the South-East Corner, which is segregated and only available to away supporters.



HOW TO BUY A TICKET/HOSPITALITY



ONLINE (available up to TWO hours before kick-off)

Ticket delivery options available:

Post – Season Tickets/Match Tickets can be posted up to **72 hours** before matchday (£2 per transaction postage fee).

Collection - Season Tickets/Match Tickets can be collected from the Ticket Office (open 10am-4pm from Monday to Saturday); if collecting on a ‘home’ match-day, you can collect your tickets from at least **THREE** hours before kick-off (up to half-time).

Print at Home (match ticket purchase only)

PHONE (available up to ONE hour before kick-off)

Disabled supporters can call our disability phonenumber on **01332 667528** (between 10am-4pm on Monday-Saturday). Please ensure your contact details are readily available, including Fan ID, full name, full address, and date of birth.

Ticket delivery options available:

Post - Tickets can be posted up to 72 hours before matchday (£2 per transaction postage fee).

Collection - Tickets can be collected from the Ticket Office (open 10am-4pm from Monday to Saturday); if collecting on a ‘home’ matchday, you can collect your tickets from at least **THREE** hours before kick-off (up to half-time).

Print at Home - (match ticket purchase only).



IN PERSON (no booking fee)

- Tickets can be purchased in person from the Pride Park Stadium Ticket Office, which is open Monday to Saturday 10am-4pm and at least **THREE** hours before kick-off and up to half-time on matchday.

TEMPORARY DISABILITIES

Supporters that have a temporary disability (e.g. broken leg) that may affect access to the stadium or seating areas should contact the Ticket Office, either in person or by calling 01332 667528, prior to the fixture, to arrange alternative seating.

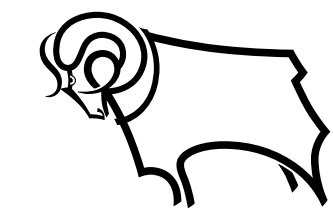

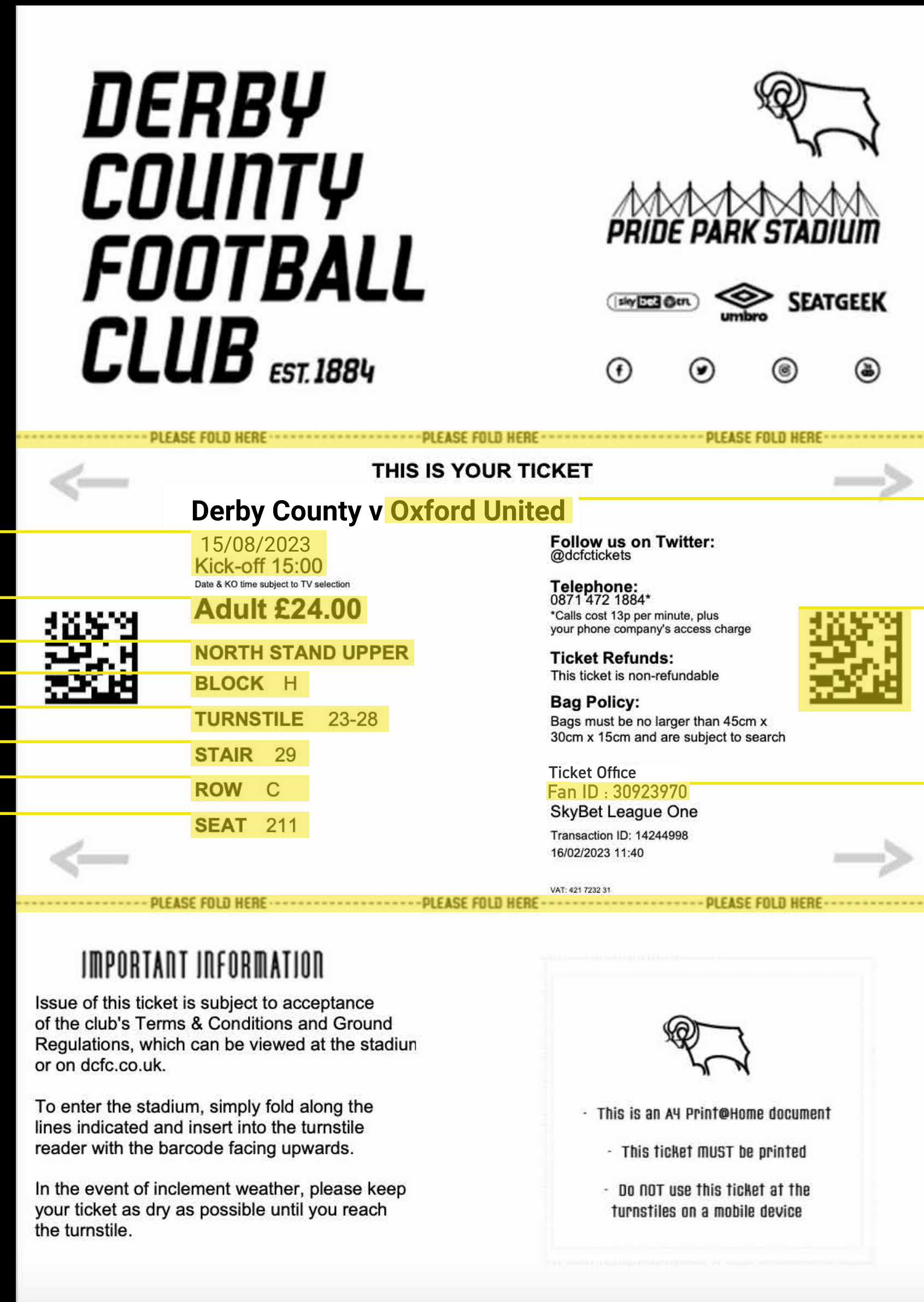

SEASON TICKETS AND AWAY TICKET MEMBERSHIP

Season Tickets

If you have purchased or renewed a seat on a seasonal basis, you will receive a pre-loaded Season Ticket Card automatically providing you with turnstile access for every home league match during the season.

Away Ticket Membership

Away Ticket Membership holders receive priority for purchasing away league match tickets during the following 48-hour ‘windows’ after the match has been announced:

Window 1: 2023/24 Away Ticket Members who attended **15** or more Away League Matches during the 2022/23 season.

Window 2: 2023/24 Away Ticket Members who attended **10** or more Away League Matches during the 2022/23 season.

Window 3: 2023/24 Away Ticket Members who attended **5** or more Away League Matches during the 2022/23 season.

Window 4: Remaining 2023/24 Away Ticket Membership Holders

Window 5: 2023/24 Season Ticket Holders.

Window 6: General Sale

Important

2022/23 season attendance is only registered for away league match tickets purchased from Derby County Ticket Office. Only one ticket can be issued per Fan ID (subject to availability).

HOSPITALITY

Disabled supporters can enjoy matches at Pride Park Stadium, by choosing from a range of hospitality packages.

Disabled supporters that require a personal assistant to accompany them within a hospitality area shall receive a complimentary Personal Assistant Match Ticket (subject to availability and qualification). All other elements of the hospitality package are to be paid at full price.

Wheelchair users are advised to speak to a Hospitality Sales Representative to ensure the best package is offered and that the chosen package has access to an available wheelchair space.

ACCESSIBILITY INFORMATION: HOSPITALITY AREAS

Main Reception (West Stand)

Two sets of double doors lead into our Main Reception area; assistance on match-days is available when entering should you require it.

The door handles are at an appropriate height for most supporters, including wheelchair users, those of a shorter stature or with limited manual dexterity.

A lowered counter is also available in this area too.

Reception (Lionel Pickering Entrance)

The door leading into this reception area is automatic and operated on a push pad system. This is an appropriate height for most supporters, including wheelchair users and those of a shorter stature.

The flooring and walls have good colour contrast and there is a lift available to all floors.



Captain’s Club

Double doors lead into the Captain’s Club. The door handles are at an appropriate height for most supporters, including wheelchair users, those of shorter stature or with limited dexterity.

The Captain’s Club has a variety of seating, at a range of heights, with and without armrests. All furniture is loose and can therefore be arranged to suit the user’s needs.

There are four sets of doors that lead to external seating with a lever handle on each door, which is suitable for most supporters, including those with limited manual dexterity, however, maybe too high for those supporters of a shorter stature.

Forward facing tills are provided, which will assist supporters who are deaf or hard of hearing.



Toyota Suite

Double wood finish doors with vision panels and brushed steel door furniture lead into the Toyota Suite. The door handles are at an appropriate height for most supporters, including wheelchair users, those of a shorter stature or with limited manual dexterity.

This suite is a large entertaining multifunction space with good views across the pitch. Full height sliding glass doors across the length of the room gives good natural light and level access to stadium seating.

The flooring and walls have good colour contrast, and the furniture is loose and can therefore be arranged to suit the user’s needs. There is a bar, however, this has no lowered counter, but staff are available to assist supporters, if required and there are forward facing tills provided, which will assist supporters who are deaf or hard of hearing.



Corolla/1884 Lounges

Double doors lead into the Corolla/1884 Lounges. The door handles are at an appropriate height for most supporters, including wheelchair users, those of a shorter stature or with limited manual dexterity.

The flooring and walls have good colour contrast, and the furniture is loose and can therefore be arranged to suit the user’s needs. There is a bar, however, this has no lowered counter, but staff are available to assist supporters if required.

There are forward facing tills provided, which will assist supporters who are deaf or hard of hearing.



The Baseball Lounge **(incorporating McFarland's Bar)**

Double doors lead into the The Baseball Lounge. The door handles are at an appropriate height for most supporters, including wheelchair users, those of a shorter stature or with limited manual dexterity.

The flooring and walls have good colour contrast, and the furniture is loose and can therefore be arranged to suit the user's needs. There is a range of seating provided, at different heights and with and without armrests. There are three bars provided in this lounge. However, these bars do not have lowered counters, but our staff are on hand to help if required.

Forward facing tills are provided, which will assist supporters who are deaf or hard of hearing.



Clough Taylor Lounge


There is a lobby into the Clough Taylor Lounge; this has a high reception desk, however, there are staff on hand to help if required.

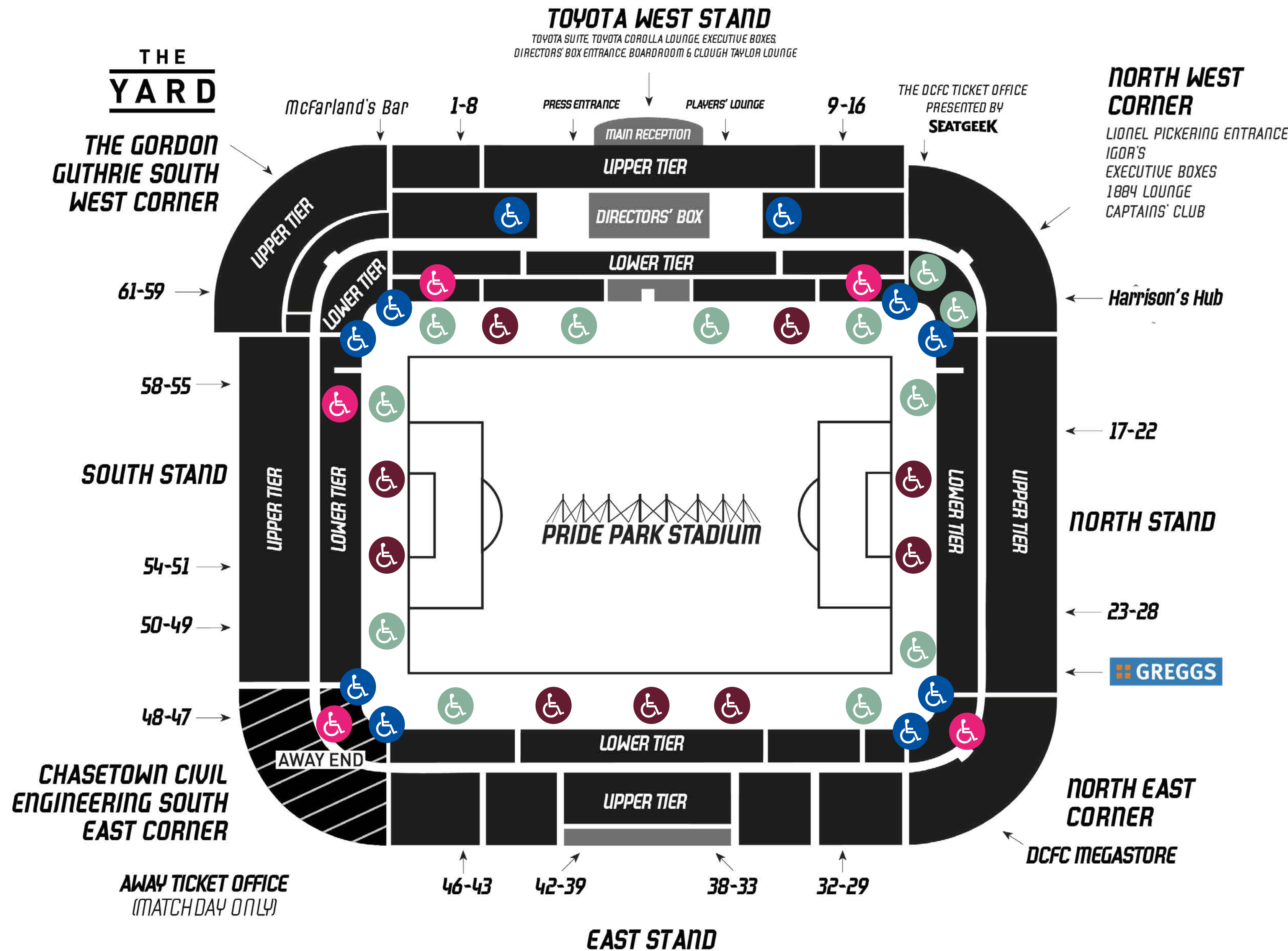
All the furniture is loose and can therefore be arranged to suit the user's needs and chairs are provided both with and without armrests.

Forward facing tills are provided, which will assist supporters who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Disability Support Stewards

We have a dedicated stewarding team who can be identified by a pink armband, on hand before, during and after the match, should you require any support.



Shuttle Service

The club operates a free shuttle service using buggies to transport supporters who need extra help from either Car Park A or around the stadium perimeter to various parts of the stadium.

This service runs up to kick-off and resumes after the final whistle, although supporters should note that due to congestion, the shuttle may suspend operation for a brief period for safety reasons.



Accessible Entrances

Accessible entrances are available in all four stands and are clearly signed. Should you require assistance, please seek advice from the nearest steward. Please refer to page 20 for their loactions.

Rest Areas

Rest points are provided throughout the concourses.



Accessible Toilets

Accessible toilets are available in all four stands and in our hospitality areas and these are clearly signed. Should you require assistance, please seek advice from the nearest steward.

All accessible toilets operate using a 'radar' key system. We would advise you to bring your 'radar' access key with you to facilitate access.

On the Concourse - Refreshments

Catering facilities are available in all parts of the stadium.

Currently, all our serving counters that are within the concourse areas are high level counters. The club makes reasonable adjustments to enable disabled supporters to access the catering facilities by instructing one of our dedicated stewards to monitor the areas in which wheelchair users are located to ascertain whether any additional help is required.



Hidden Disabilities

Sunflower Lanyard Scheme

Derby County Football Club have adopted the Sunflower Lanyard scheme.

What is a Sunflower Lanyard?

A Sunflower Lanyard lets us know you have a hidden disability and may appreciate a little extra help when visiting Derby County Football Club. We also offer Sunflower Wristbands, for those disabled supporters that require to wear something a little more discreet.

How can I get a Sunflower Lanyard/Wristband?

Instruction Cards

Instruction cards can be used to give specific instructions, particularly to stewards on a matchday. The disabled supporter just needs to show the card to request support, for example, ‘please scan my ticket for me.’

These cards are particularly useful for supporters with communication disabilities, including those with learning difficulties or autism.

Sensory Room

The Sensory Room is designed for children and adults who have additional needs; particularly aimed at those living with autism.

The equipment was kindly funded by the Shaun Barker Foundation and the box provides a safe and relaxing space to enjoy a Derby County game from inside or outside.

Families can enjoy the game with the support of Derby County Community Trust trained staff. Children with limited communication can enjoy relaxing music and can play with tangible and sensory stimulating specific items.

The Sensory Room aims to eliminate any segregation from who can, and who cannot, enjoy a game of football at Pride Park Stadium.

From the 23/24 season we will have two separate rooms to allow more families to experience the facility. Please note, spaces are in very high demand, and you should expect to fill in an expression of interest rather than book a fixture.

Assistance Dogs

Any supporter wishing to attend the stadium with an assistance dog will need to email disability.access@dcfc.co.uk or call our Disability Team on 01332 667528, so that we can ensure that appropriate match tickets (subject to availability) are allocated, and adequate arrangements have been made.



Audio Descriptive Commentary

An audio descriptive commentary service is available for blind or partially sighted supporters.

Please contact the Disability Team on 01332 667528 to reserve a receiver no later than 24 hours prior to the fixture date (subject to availability). Please note that you will need to bring your own earphones (round jack).



Induction Loop Facilities

Induction Loop equipped seating is available in certain parts of the stadium, including the away supporters seating area.

Please contact the Disability Team on 01332 667528 for more information.

ACCESSIBLE SEATING

Accessible seating, including wheelchair spaces, are subject to availability and qualification.

Disabled supporters not requiring accessible seating can sit anywhere in the ground with their personal assistant (subject to qualification), providing they can access the area safely.

Seating requirements should be stipulated at the time of purchasing a ticket to ensure appropriate seating is provided.



Wheelchair Spaces

West Stand Lower Block I (Elevated wheelchair Platform)

Wheelchair Platform I consists of two tiers and both levels are accessed via a lift; the Personal Assistant Ticket is allocated next to the wheelchair user.

West Stand Lower Block J (Elevated wheelchair Platform)

Platform J is accessed by an enclosed lift; the Personal Assistant Ticket is allocated directly behind the wheelchair user's space.

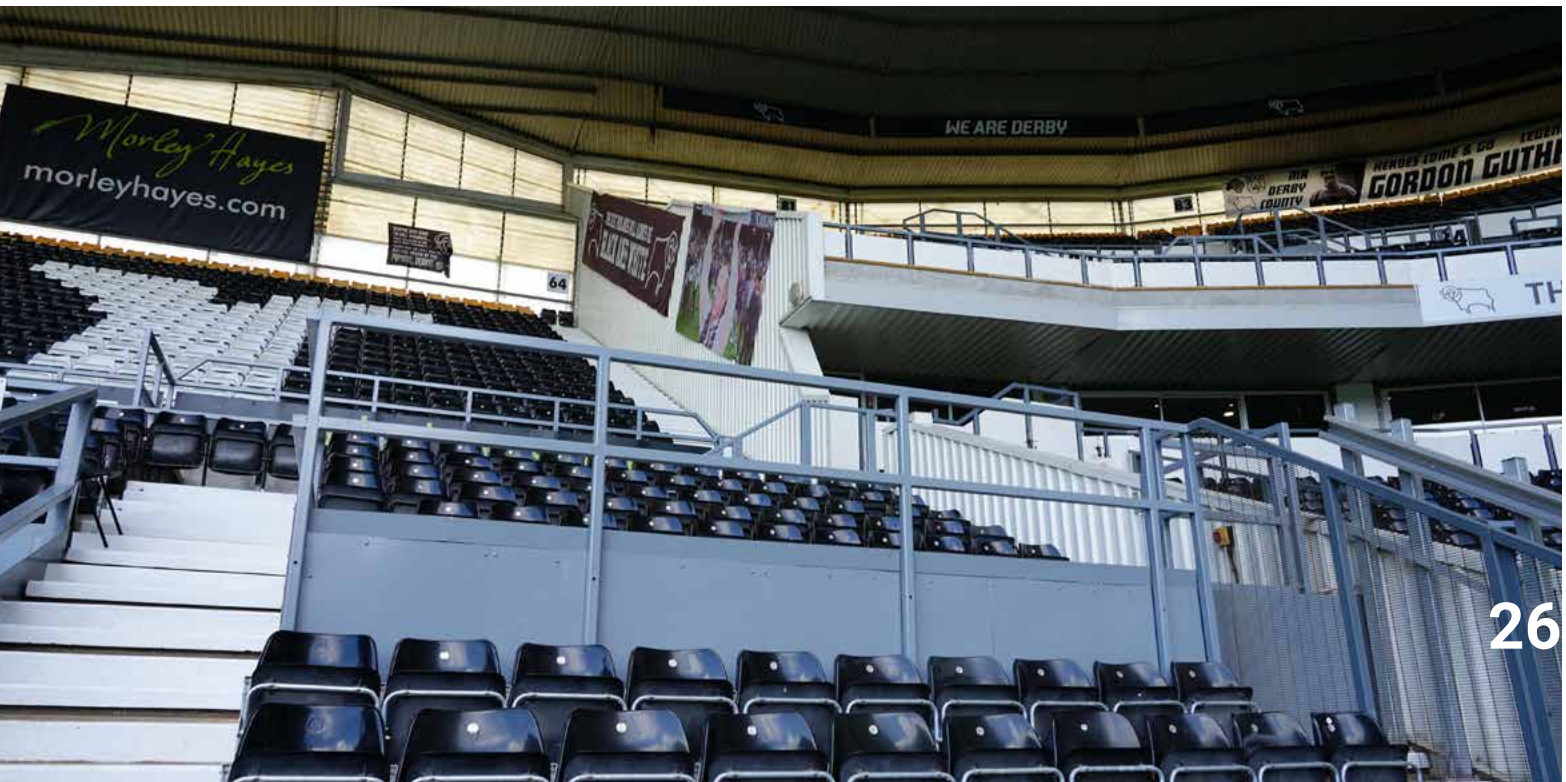

South Stand Lower Block F (Elevated wheelchair Platform)

Platform F is accessed via a lift; the Personal Assistant Ticket is allocated directly behind the wheelchair user's space.

***North-East Corner Lower Blocks A & F
(Elevated wheelchair Platform)***

Platform A/F is accessed by an enclosed lift; the Personal Assistant Ticket is allocated next to the wheelchair user.

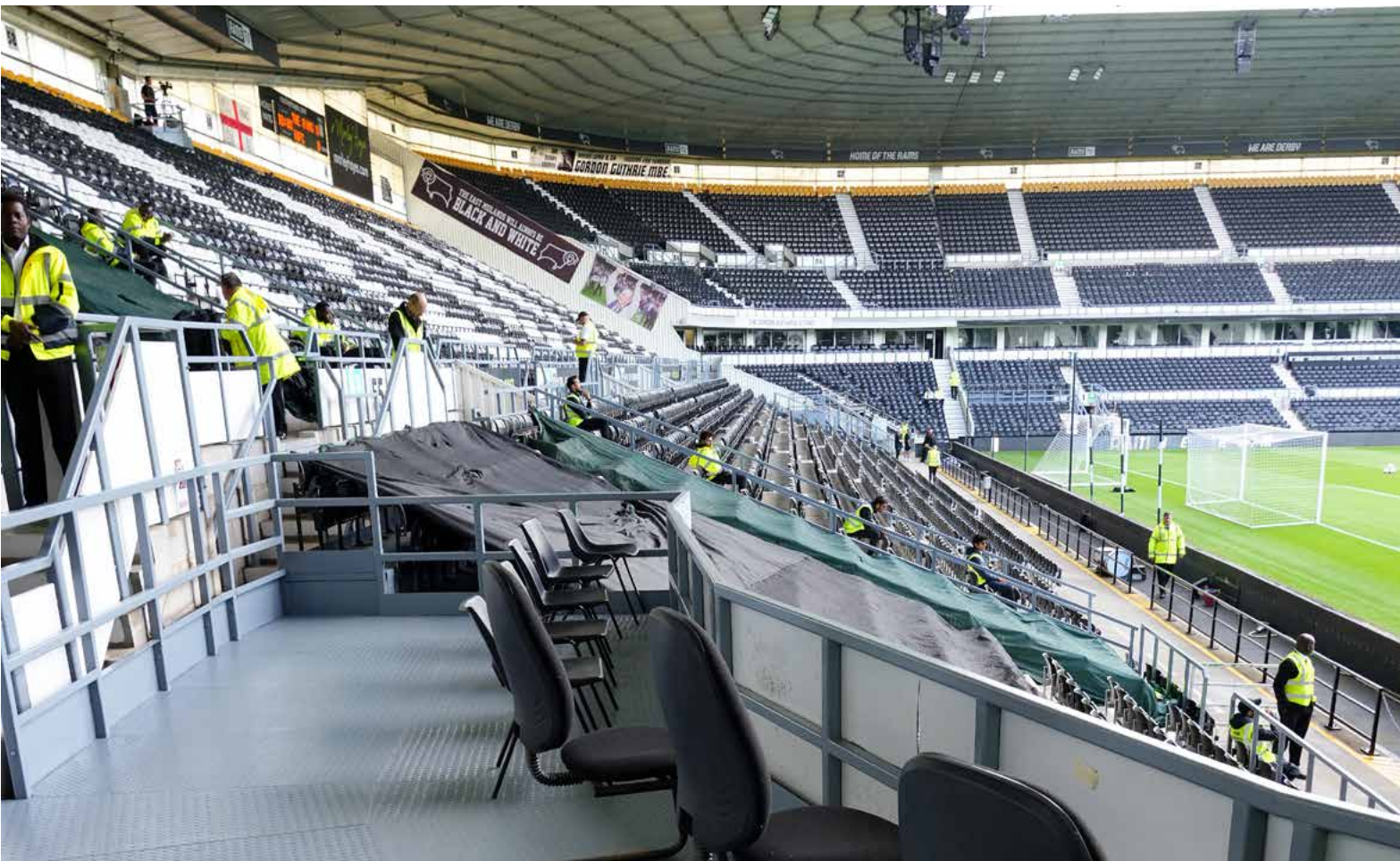

***South-East Corner Lower Block A
(Away Disabled Supporters)***

Platform A is accessed by an enclosed lift; the Personal Assistant Ticket is allocated next to the wheelchair user.

Pitchside Wheelchair Spaces

Pitchside wheelchair spaces are available in all four stands and these spaces are accessed via one of our accessible entrances (please refer to the map above). The Personal Assistant Ticket is allocated next to the wheelchair user. Choosing to sit at pitchside also gives the wheelchair user the opportunity to purchase additional seats for their friends and family, so that they can all sit together (subject to availability).

Level Access Seating

Level access seating is available (front row - step free) in all four stands of the stadium and these seats can be accessed via an accessible entrance.

FAMILY EXPERIENCE

Derby County Football Club prides itself on providing a fun day out for all families when they visit Pride Park Stadium and the club has been awarded the EFL's Family Excellence Award in each of the past seven seasons, as well as achieving the prestigious gold standard accolade for its work in engaging families on matchdays on two occasions.

The Family Seating Area at Pride Park Stadium has designated blocks in the Northeast Corner, with upper and lower tier seating available.

Families can also purchase an exclusive Rammie's Kids Meal in this area too.

Rammie and Ewie's activity zone

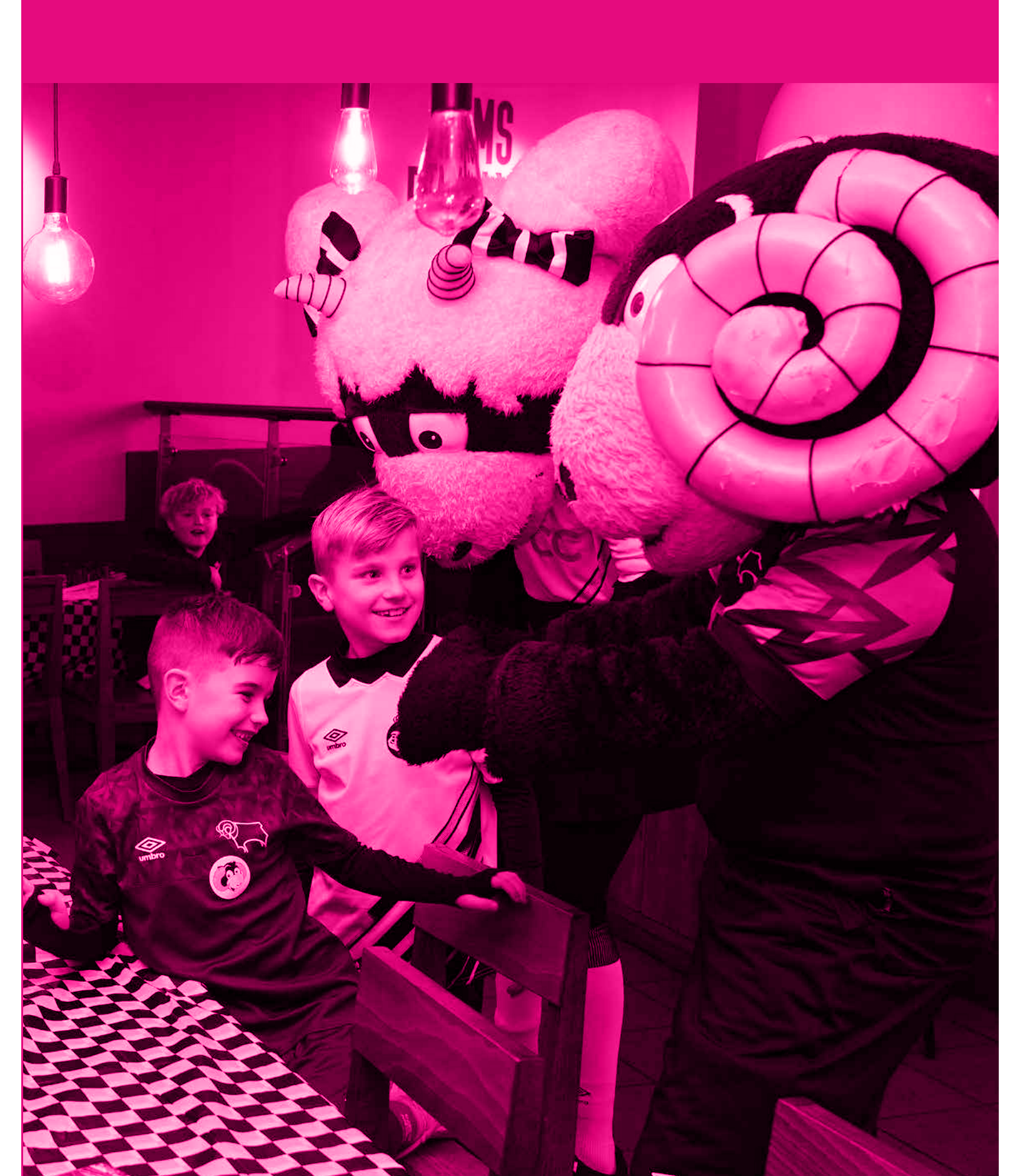
Last season, we introduced a brand-new free fan engagement initiative, designed with families in mind labelled as Rammie and Ewie's Activity Zone. The Family Fun Zone gives families an interactive and enjoyable safe space to take their youngsters and keep them entertained before every home weekend game. Rammie and Ewie's Activity Zone is hosted in Harrison's Hub at the Community Corner, which is in the Northwest Corner of Pride Park Stadium.

Youngsters can take part in a selection of exciting, family-friendly activities ahead of kick-off. We have colouring and crafts competitions, face-painting*, foosball, ping-pong table, games, meet and greet opportunities with Club Mascots Rammie and Ewie and the Pride Park Tuck Shop (small change required).

The club's home kit is worn by the First Team for one season, unless otherwise stated. The away kit, goalkeeping and third kits will operate for one to two seasons; will be changed according to announcements made at the time of launch and displayed on the club's website and club shop.

Access Information

Fully glazed double doors lead into the DCFC Megastore. The doors are manual; therefore, we have staff members on hand to assist disabled supporters if required. The door handles are at an appropriate height for most users, including wheelchair users and those with limited manual dexterity.

There is plenty of circulation space, however, on matchdays the shop may become quite congested at times.

The DCFC Megastore does have a lowered counter provided, which will assist wheelchair users and those of a shorter stature and is in the far corner of the shop.

A hearing induction loop is provided, and this will assist hearing aid users.



Returns Policy

In addition to your statutory rights, items can be returned or exchanged within 30 days of purchase for a full refund or exchange of equivalent value, provided the item is still in its original condition and accompanied by an itemised receipt.

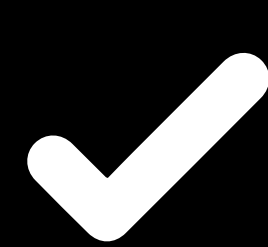
Personalised items are exempt from our returns policy and cannot be exchanged or refunded. Your statutory rights are not affected by our returns policy.

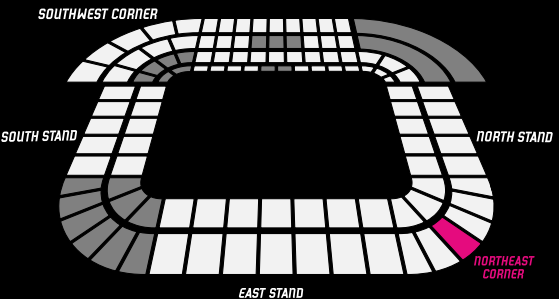
Traffic can get busy around the stadium so make sure you arrive within plenty of time.



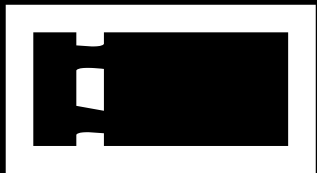
Wrap up warm if the game is during the winter months; it can get rather cold in the concourses and at your seats!



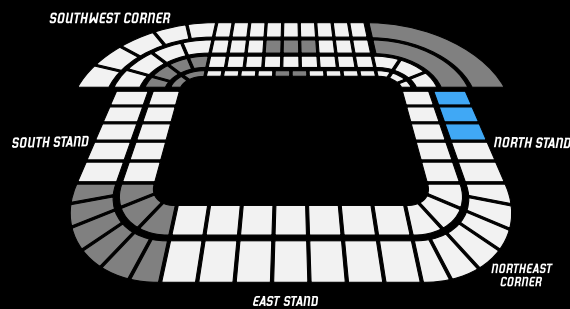
The DCFC Megastore is in the North-East corner of the stadium.



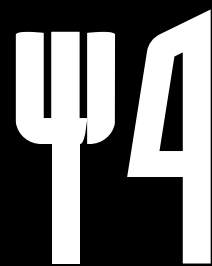
The ATM is located on the outside of the North-East corner of the stadium.



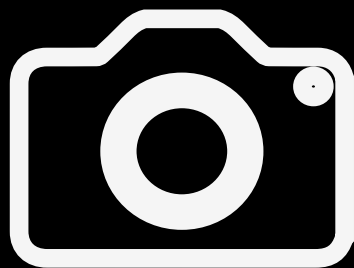

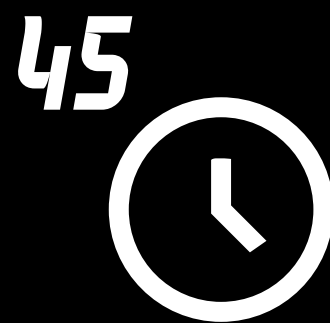
For all ticket access issues, please go to the North Stand Access windows. Located to the left of Harrison's Hub.



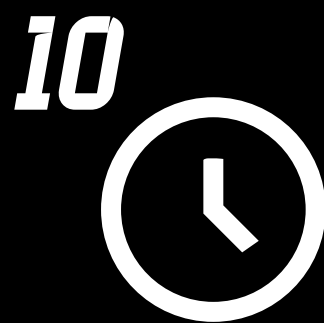
There are plenty of food & drink options inside the concourses and around the ground, look out for the kids' meal deals if you're a family attending.



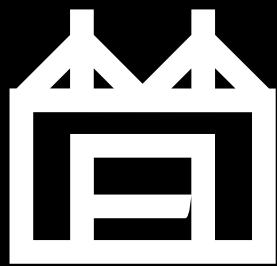
Unfortunately, cameras and any device that are capable of streaming video content is prohibited from the stadium.



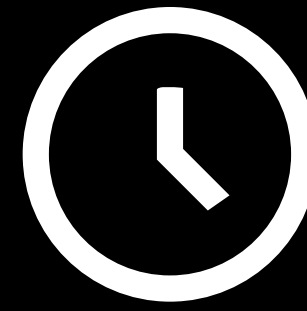
The warm-up normally begins 45 minutes before kick-off - don't miss the teams being put through their paces!
